

THE GREATEST CONQUEST IS SELFCONTROL

You are running late and arrive 5 minutes before the session to play with a new partner . You quickly discuss the standard bidding and defence agreeing that you are just going to "wing it".

The first round goes quite well and you are probably slightly ahead. The fun begins with the first board of round 2. With all vulnerable East your right hand opponent opens 1NT. You hold \bigstar KQ6 \blacktriangledown KQ9 \spadesuit AK32 \clubsuit A74 What on earth are you going to do with 21 points? It would be so much easier if you were East's partner! You are deep in thought wondering whether you should double. If you do partner will surely bid. Suddenly a light dawns. Your bridge teacher kept telling the class to count up to 40 on every hand. You now realise that West and North have a total of 4 points or less between them. Assuming partner has 2 points the only thing you can do is pass which you do. West and North also pass You have a difficult lead problem but finally settle for the 2D. The full hand is:



East manages to scramble 5 tricks for -200. He can't help giving you these funny looks as you keep on winning tricks. The bridgemate reveals that most Souths went down in no trumps. Your partner is absolutely delighted and says to you "This could be the start of a beautiful partnership " As you start the next board you are thinking to yourself " I hope I can restrain myself for the rest of the session so I won't blot my copybook."

GARBAGE STAYMAN

You'd better believe it! It's a convention which works well when it comes up. You can only use it over 1NT or 2NT(20-21). Responder must have a void or singleton club. It can only be used with simple Stayman, Here are some examples: Partner opens 1NT and you hold: $48643 \le 8643 \le 8632 \le 4$ You respond 2C and now pass whatever partner bids(2D,2H or2S). you pass. Exactly the same would occur if partner opens 2NT. In both examples you know that no trumps would be a disaster. There's a story about a husband thinking they were playing Extended Stayman and bid 3C over his wife's 2C. At the end of the hand after he went down 3 in 3NT his wife said to him "Okay, you can take out the garbage for the next 2 weeks"
