

Pre-Paid System

The new system has been in place for some eight months now and makes life much easier for all concerned. This saves players having to bring cash and saves the club endless hours of admin work.

If you are not on the pre-paid system please consider joining as it is so easy. You can fill in the joining form at the bottom of this page, cut it off and bring it to the club. You can make a deposit and then when you are running out of funds the directors will let you know you need to top up your account. This is just like an opal card without the automatic top up.

I am working on a new system that will automatically top up your account but this is going to take some time to put into action.

PP system monthly statements

Where we have an email address for a member of the PP System, monthly statements are sent out in the first week of the month for the previous month. The statement shows the opening balance, games played, any deposits made during the month and the closing balance.

Not Receiving a Monthly Statement

If you are not receiving a monthly statement and you filled out your email address details on the PP System Application form, then first check in the trash or spam folders in your emails. It may be that the statements are sitting there. If they cannot be found then please contact Margaret in Admin on (02) 9411 3527.

BIDDING IN 4TH SEAT

After the bidding goes 1C, 1D, 1H OR 1S and the bidding goes pass, pass, pass it is often difficult to know what to do. Have a look at the following situations.

W N E S 1D P P ?

Here are 3 different hands you might hold in 3rd seat :

- 1) ★ 4 ♥KQJ972, ♦ A85 ♣A65
- 2) ★ 94 ♥ QJ1092, ♦ A85, ♣ 652
- 3) ♠ K4 ♥K92 ♦J985, ♣ A652

In each case N/S is not vulnerable. What would you bid with each of the above 3 hands over 1D ?

With hand 1) you should jump to 2H. This shows an intermediate hand with at least 5 hearts.

With hand 2} you should simply overcall 1H.

With hand 3} you should bid 1NT showing 11-14 balanced and a heart stopper.



Underbidding and Overbidding

W N E S 2C P 2D ? N/S VULNERABLE

You hold: ♠ 73 ♥ AK963 ♦ 932 ♣ 765

What's the problem? Pass of course. A good example of underbidding. Whatever contract they reach (and West is likely to be the declarer) you want a heart lead. if you think you might play in 2Hx you are dreaming! West will bid his suit or no trumps. If he doubles it is most unlikely that East will pass.

But if you overcall 2H with ♠ 73 ♥ KJ963 ♦ 932 ♣ 765 you are now overbidding!
