


You are sitting East and N/S are vulnerable. The bidding is as follows:



WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Playing weak twos you pick up ♠ AK9643 ♥-, ♦ Q942, ♣873. You are South and the dealer so you open 2S. The bidding continues :

S W N E E/W vulnerable 2S 3H X P

What now? You know you were a bit naughty opening a weak two with a void but not too many players would resist the temptation. So, you have to decide what partner's double means. Does he want you to bid 3S or 4S. Or what about 4D?

If you are contemplating any of the above, you have missed the boat. Partner's double is 100% penalties. There are many other bids he could have made and he knows your hand whereas you know nothing about his: Here is a possible hand for partner:

PLEASE HELP YOUR FRIENDLY DIRECTOR

At the end of a session there is always a lot of cleaning up to do. Apart from organising the final details, the director then has to make sure that the room is clean for the next session. It would be of great help if all players make sure that their table is left in a very tidy condition.

You pick up ♠ K64 ♥AQJ, D J75, ♣ J742. Partner opens 1D and you must decide what to bid. You settle for 2NT and partner rebids 4NT. Can this be asking for Aces or a quantitative bid. With maximum 12 points you respond 6NT. The lead is the QS & partner puts down : ♠ A72 ♥953, D AKQ6, ♣ KQ10 The contract hinges on the heart finesse works!

Join the pre-paid today online just go to the web page click the \$ sign do a top-up and we will set your PP account up for you nothing more to do just turn up and play.

You will get a detailed statement at the end of each month, with your starting balance and ending balance so you can track all sessions played. (If you don't receive a monthly statement please contact the office)

When your balance is getting low, the director in your session will ask you to top up or simply go to the director's desk and ask to top up. You can also top-up online simply go to our web page and hit the \$ sign on the left use the drop-down box to choose an amount.



West passes and North opens 1C. East makes the pressure bid of 3D! South doubles 3D and West makes the pressure bid of 5D. You have to feel sorry for poor old North. He can make 4H or 4S but cannot make 5H or 5S. 5Dx is -300 as opposed to -620 for 4H or 4S.

THE PLAY

North must be considered very unlucky as 6S relies on the heart finesse. An interesting is that N/S can make 5C!
