It's seven o'clock on a Wednesday
The regular crowd shuffles in
There's a pair discussing their system
Desperately trying to win

Your regular partner Jim rushes in at 7:25pm just before the evening session is about to start at 7:30pm. He is holding a piece of paper in his hand. He passes it over to you. Your immediate response is, "Jim, I've told you before no new

additions to the system until after the session". Jim replies, "I promise you this is great. You can use this convention with a variety of hands. I read it in the latest Australian Bridge magazine".

Jim looks at me wandering off to our assigned table for the first session. He continues, "OK let's leave it for now and discuss it after the session".

You start off at table 1 against 2 lovely ladies, Dina and Julia. The first 2 boards seem flat and then comes board 3.

East/West are vulnerable, and Jim and you are not vulnerable.

Sitting South, as dealer, you hold

**A**A876 **∀**KQJ32 **A**Q **A**Q4


You open 1 ♥ and your partner bids 2 ♦. You reverse into 2 ♠ because you have a very good hand. Your partner, who doesn't believe in wasting time in the auction, trots out 4NT and you reply 5 ♥ showing two controls without the ♠Q. Partner now bids 6 ♥. You thought that 4NT agreed ♠s, so what does 6 ♥ mean. You guess it is choice of contracts, so with a good ♥ suit, you decide to pass and hope for the best. Dina, as West, leads the ♣T and dummy comes down.

♦9 ♥AT95 ♦KT972 ♣J73

Your first thought is that at least this contract is better than 6. BRIDGE HUMOUR 6 Your second thought is that you wonder whether this highly unusual bidding is included on the piece of paper Jim held. Your third thought is, Dina has led the unbid suit and I shall probably have to gracefully concede one down. Julia wins with A and starts thinking. You wonder what she is thinking about but hope springs eternal. After quite a while, Julia puts the K on the table.

You win the ♠A and draw trumps and throw your losing ♣ on the ♦K and claim. You are a little bewildered, but it is what it is.

The full hand was



As you enter the score, you hear the following commentary at the table.

Julia says, "Dina, why didn't you bid 3.?". Dina says, "Julia, I was vulnerable with a poor suit. Why didn't you pre-empt with that great spade suit?".

Julia replied, "We are vulnerable and look at all my losers. I guess, I was a bit conservative. I am sorry Dina that I asked why you did not bid as it was a pretty ordinary suit."

Jim could not help himself. He said, "If either of you ladies had bid, I would have bid the slam directly. When you play a sophisticated system like ours, 6♥ is automatic over a pre-emptive bid by either one of you."

You think to yourself. We have just started play on a Wednesday

You say to yourself with a grin There are three discussing this auction It is time for a tonic and gin





NSWBA Progress on Restructure

Update: No 4 (July 11)

It has been a while since the last update on how we are moving forward with the restructure of the NSWBA. We aim to strengthen the future of Bridge across NSW with the objective of setting up two new focussed organisations for success. The proposed plan is to:

Create an independent club in inner Sydney. Its members will be both the social and competitive players of the current NSWBA.

- The new club would be like the current SBC (Sydney Bridge Centre) with the board focussed on its members' needs, without the complexities and distractions of the current state structure.
- A board of directors for the new club is currently being set up and we will be sharing more detail on this soon.

Create a new **State peak body for Bridge** in NSW. Its members will be the 158 NSW Bridge Clubs that are currently affiliated to the NSWBA.

- The new NSW peak body would assume all responsibilities of the NSWBA, including evolving bridge in the state, running competitive events, selecting and supporting representative teams, and support services to clubs across NSW.
- A board of directors for the new NSW peak body and a Council to provide guidance are being set up and we will also be sharing more detail on this soon.

To manage this process, a Transition Committee has been established to work through the many issues required to set up these two new organisations for success. This committee will oversee the restructure of the NSWBA to form the two new organisations outlined above, and implement governance over the strategic, legal and financial aspects of the restructure.

The initial members of Transition Committee are:

- Dagmar Neumann NSWBA Councillor, Project Leader
- Glenda Parmenter Founding Chair of the NSW bridge peak body
- Mary Anne Loveridge Founding Chair of the new bridge club
- Jake Andrew Program Manager


We will be providing regular email updates on the progress of the restructure. Our upcoming updates will go into additional detail about the purpose and objectives of these two new organisations. We will also introduce the members making up the new boards and their roles, so please keep your eye out for further updates – in your inbox and on the NSWBA website.

### Update & An Introduction No 5 (July 31)

Thank you for your questions and other responses to our last update about the NSWBA Transition. It is wonderful to know that so many of you feel passionately about the future of bridge.

In the most recent message, we introduced the Transition Committee that will oversee the evolution of the NSWBA. This raised important questions around governance, which is the system by which an organisation is controlled and operates, and the mechanisms by which it, and its people, are held to account.[1] Please find a diagram summarising the existing governance structure below.

The NSWBA Council has delegated authority to the Transition Committee to oversee the restructure of the NSWBA. The NSWBA Council receives a briefing on developments every few weeks, and provides input on priorities, direction and timelines. It is the Council that eventually makes all the significant decisions about this project.



An important message from John Scudder, Chair of the NSWBA Council:

The Strategic Review undertaken in 2022 made clear recommendations on how to shape the future of bridge in NSW, and what strategic obstacles require attention. This future vision accords with the direction that the NSWBA directors have asked the Transition Committee to implement.

I believe our community needs some renewal through new people who bring additional skills, ideas and energy. I am optimistic that the many new volunteers will ensure continuity and strengthening of our operations. For clarity - the NSW Bridge Association Limited is a single legal entity, and any references to "new" organisations does not mean two new companies will be created.

It is pleasing that two groups of skilled volunteers are preparing to lead once the separation happens. In our last update these groups were referred to using board language – for those that have asked for clarification: technically these are two committees of Council that are working on defining objectives, working structures, budgets and plans to ensure the success of the two organisations going forward. Until the separation occurs, these groups will serve as advisors to the present directors. Our plans will be communicated appropriately and of course be subject to member review and approval.

Please join me in expressing the Council's gratitude to the many volunteers – on the Transition Committee, Club Proxy Board, State Proxy Board and many others without a formal role. They have a great deal of work to do to implement this change and set up our community for success. Should you have any concerns about the restructure of the NSWBA you should contact the members of the Transition Committee or myself.

The Transition Committee is made up of six members with a Project Leader, Program Manager, and two representatives each from the Club and State Proxy Boards. Best we do some introductions

# **Increase in ABF Capitation and Masterpoint Fees**

Hi Everyone,

I'm writing to inform you of upcoming increases in ABF fees.

Following the impact of the COVID pandemic, 2023 is a pivotal year for bridge in Australia and in implementing its Strategic Plan 2022-2025 to attract, develop and retain players, the ABF has approved the increase in its capitation fees to **\$20 per player**, effective from 1st April 2024.

Masterpoint fees across all levels will also increase in line with inflation along with the commencement of a three-year adjustment to gold points to align with the top level red masterpoints.

While the NSW Bridge Association is currently going through a transformation aimed at developing bridge in NSW and better supporting affiliated clubs, there are no plans at this stage to increase the state affiliation fees.


