- Reduces the cost burden for younger players, particularly students who may not have disposable income.
- Ensures bridge remains an accessible game for all demographics.

By removing financial barriers and providing a welcoming environment, North Shore Bridge Club (NSBC) is committed to fostering the next generation of bridge players.

Background

The Australian Bridge Federation (ABF) Youth Club allows all players under the age of 26 (as of January 1st) to enjoy the rights and privileges of ABF membership without needing to join a state-based affiliated club. Membership of the ABF Youth Club is automatically terminated on January 1st of the year after a player turns 26.

NSBC Youth Membership Benefits

To encourage and support youth participation in bridge, NSBC offers Complimentary Club Membership to all ABF Youth members. This membership will be classified as alternate membership, meaning that the ABF Youth Club remains the home club of the member.

Fee Exemptions

For NSBC Youth Members:

- Free Session Fees for all NSBC online and face-to-face sessions until their 16th birthday.
- Free Congress Fees for all NSBC online and face-to-face sessions until their 16th birthday.
