How Long have you been Playing Bridge	About 15 years
How Many Master Points have you earned (break down into Green/Red/Gold)	Around 3000. ~2500 gold ~450 red ~50 green
While you have a lot of Master Points you have more Red and Gold Points than Green Points — why is that?	95% of the bridge that I play is at the state/national level.
In which tournaments have you had the most success in last 5 years. Which events have you represented Club/State/Australia	I've done relatively well in national events. Regularly making the knockout stages of the Canberra and Gold Coast tournaments and a couple of wins in the VCC. I have represented Victoria on the youth and open teams and also Australia internationally on the youth and open teams.
What Conventions do you use when Bidding, over and above the 5 Standard Conventions	I don't play a lot of conventions but I am a big advocate for 2/1 GF (Game Force). Depending on the partner I also like transfer responses over 1C. Two-way checkback is another good one that I use with most of my regular partners
Which do you think are the most effective Bidding Conventions other than the 5 Std Conventions for: a. Rookies b. Restricted Players	Rookies: Transfers to the minors and a better understanding of reverses. Restricted - Transitioning from regular Blackwood to Roman Keycard Blackwood and also from Standard American to 2/1, and Two-way checkback too.
Defense is about 50% of the game what tips would give to players to handle this part of the game	Listen to the auction! There are a lot of inferences and negative inferences that can be drawn. Don't automatically lead back what partner led. Make sure there is a reason for everything you do rather than just playing randomly. Always try to picture declarer's shape and points, it will help you construct the whole hand.
What Conventions do you use for Defense/Hordo you approach Defense	wThe three main conventions are count, attitude and suit preference. Which signal you use depends on the situation. A

	very simple signal to start off with is low encourage.
For New, Rookie and Restricted Players what errors do you most commonly see. How should they correct them.	The most common error I see is miscounting suits. Especially when drawing trumps. What a lot of people do is try to keep track of all 13. What I recommend is to only keep count of your opponents' trumps. For instance, in an 8 card fit you're missing 5 trumps. So keep track of 5 instead of all 13!!
What do you see as the best ways for players to improve their game	Playing at least 3 times a week and either with or against good opposition who are willing to go over the hands with you.
Do you try to work out what cards your opponents have a. During Bidding b. After the first lead How do you do that	During the bidding. Especially if I can anticipate if I'll be on opening lead. I want to have a picture of what the dummy and declarer's hands are before I lead. I listen to the auction and narrow down which suit I'd like to lead.

EXTEND YOUR BRIDGE KNOWLEDGE

EXTENDING ON THE FIVE ESSENTIAL CONVENTIONS - Stayman, Transfers, Strong 2 Clubs, Blackwood and Pre-Empts

As mentioned by Jamie Two Way Checkback is a convention worth getting to know. Eddie Kantar, a leading American player and teacher, pointed out the un-playability of standard bidding after a 1NT rebid by opener.

The options for partner are limited as there is limited knowledge of the composure of the Openers hand other than a minimum of 12 points to open. Thus Checkback in various forms was developed. As a first stage we will only initially look at Simple Checkback

After Opener opens the bidding with a suit, for the sake of convenience let's say 1C, Opps pass and you as Parter bid another suit, say 1 Heart. Opener then rebids 1NT, showing effectively12-14 points balanced with no immediate fit.

Now you have 13 HCP in your hand and you know you should be bidding for game. Responder can use (by agreement with Partner) 2Clubs – Checkback – asking for more information. This is very similar to Stayman. Responder is seeking more knowledge of Openers hand.

Does Opener have 3 card support for the suit Responder bid the first time around and does Opener have four cards in any unbid Majors.

Openers Responses to the 2C Checkback in order of response are:

3 card support for Responders suit

4 cards in any unbid Major

5 cards in the suit that they opened with in the first place (in this case Clubs) or – I have none of

the above - 2NT.

What happens next – Responder should now have a pretty clear idea of where to go and what bid will take them to game. Any new suit from Opener is forcing and 2NT is invitational and denying a fit.

Checkback is a protocol taught at NSBC and players are encouraged to go to lessons to understand the value of this playing option

The Hand to the right is typical of an opportunity to use Checkback Opener has opened 1D, Opps have passed Partner has responded 1S Opener apparently does not have support for Spades and so bids 1NT - indicating 12-14 points

Partner has 11 points and is looking for game

Partner has 11 points and is looking for game or at least a contract in a suit
Hence the response would 2C
"Opener tell me what you have" and from there the bidding can to go game potentially or at least to a contract in a suit

DEAR DIRECTOR


My tip for this month. If you are going to Double your Opps for penalties (X) only do so if they don't have anywhere to run.

Board 17 Open Wednesday 19th Feb Face to Face East Lindfield

North has only 13 HCP but only 3 losers. So it is a toss up, some people may open 2 Clubs game force and now you will easily get to 6 Clubs or 6 Diamonds. There is some argument for opening 2 Clubs as you don't have Spades and the opps can bid over the top of you.

At our table the Opps (N) opened 1 Club. E (me) called 2 Spades. Opps (S) passed.

My partner (W) called 4 Spades. North passed. However with 2 good suits I think North should have called 5C (or 5D if S had responded to the opening bid of 2 Clubs. If that had happened, East/West may still bid to 5 Spades, which makes



to a spaces, willer makes.

It is very hard for N/S to know what to do. There were lots of interesting results from 5 Spades being doubled and making and 6 Diamonds doubled and making. This is why we keep coming back to Bridge!

Board 6 12th Feb 1.30pm Open Real Bridge

This is an amazing hand. A lot of pairs bid to 4 Spades and 5 Spades and did not make it. You need to make a plan for this hand. With these "wild" hands. Take a moment and work out what could go wrong. 6 Spades is a great contract.


One pair bid as below.

East Pass South 1D West 1H North 1S East 3H South 4S

West Pass North 6S

West lead the A Hearts

Trump the Ace of Hearts lead in N with a low S. Play to the Queen of clubs. The Opps (W) can trump this but you are still in control of the hand. You win any return with a trump by N. N now leads another Club and is trumped by S using an Honour. Opps now only have 2 trumps (W) and you can draw them with another two trumps leading from S with 4 S as the second trump then to get to Clubs in N by using Jack S over the 4 S and play the remaining clubs.



ASK GARY

Why is the Standard American system sometimes called SAYC or Yellow Card?

You may have heard the term The Standard American Yellow Card or SAYC. It is called "Yellow Card" because it was originally introduced by the ACBL (American Contract Bridge League) in a yellow booklet format. This booklet contained the guidelines and conventions of the SAYC bidding system, making it easy for players to reference during games. The colour yellow was chosen to make the booklet stand out and be easily recognizable.

Over time, the name "Yellow Card" stuck, and it became synonymous with the SAYC system. It's a handy tool for beginners and casual players, providing a standardised approach to bidding in bridge. In Australia we learn the same system however just call it Standard or Standard American (as we don't have the booklet) and FYI it is known as a green system worldwide (even in the US). I will talk about different base systems in future articles.
