**only spent two weeks** chasing overdue accounts instead of the usual **two and a half months**.

This isn’t about naming or shaming anyone. It’s about showing how, **together**, we keep our costs down.

A quick reality check:

## **OUR MEMBERS OUR CLUB**

Recently the Australian Bridge Federation recognised  
players in each Masterpoint Rank – from the top, a  
combination of Gold and Silver Grand Masters, to  
intermediate ranks, to Rookie and down to Nil.

The McCutcheon award dates back to the seventies at  
which time only the "Player of the Year" was  
recognised. The McCutcheon awards are named after  
George McCutcheon, who was a prominent member of the  
Bridge community in the 1950's -70's.

George McCutcheon graduated in Medicine from the

Aberdeen University in Scotland and migrated to Australia in the 1950's. He was a keen Bridge player and after immigrating had a profound influence on the organization of Bridge in Queensland and Australia. Dr. McCutcheon was responsible for the introduction of a Masterpoint scheme in Queensland and played a significant role in the establishment of the National Masterpoint arrangements. He also saw the need for a major congress in Queensland that would attract players from the rest of Australia and overseas, a vision that resulted in the organization of the Gold Coast Congress.

The McCutcheon awards are quite simply calculated on the number of Masterpoints accumulated individually in the 12-month period from January to December and are identified in early January the following year. It is clear looking at the results that those players who consistently play in Red Point and Gold Point Events score very highly. This year the highest Masterpoint earner was Pauline Gumby who also gained the distinction of becoming the first Diamond Grand Master and won a massive 504.01 Masterpoints in the 12-month period. One of her partners Warren Lazer won 499.9 Masterpoints and these players are in a different stratosphere to your humble Editor.

In this year's McCutcheon Awards a number of NSBC players held very high positions

Patrick Jiang was first in the Bronze Life Section

Meera Kudva was first in the Bronze Regional Section

Criag Beconsall was first in Silver Local

Paul Birkby and Debra Birkby were second and third respectively in the Regional Section

Jenny Clarke was 5th in the Local Section

There many other members who did well and achieved a high status. I collated a list of various NSBC members who finished in the top 20 nationally which must be seen as an outstanding accomplishment.

I caught up with one of NSBC players who finished fifth in her division, Jenny Clarke, a relative new-comer to our Bridge ranks joining in 2023 and who built in 2025 a record of 41.8 Masterpoints in the Local Division over the 12 month period - in one of the most competitive of sections, given the number of players (see below for the breakup of players into ABF Ranks).



Jenny's points are largely made up of Green Points and we know how difficult it is to build Green Points, so a great outcome.

Jenny began her Bridge life initially undertaking Bridge lessons at TNSBC just before Covid. During Covid I was transferred to Singapore for work – I was a Tax Partner at KPMG and there was no bridge to play there at that time.

I had an affinity with playing cards through my family – we often played 500, so this gave me an understanding of card feel and a general understanding of how to play cards. I took up Bridge on a consistent basis when I retired about 2 years ago. Started playing Bridge regularly with my mother at Turramurra – a great mutual interest for us. Bridge then became an indispensable part of Jenny's life.

I have made many friends who also love the complexity and challenge of Bridge. I play regularly with these friends as well as with my mother and my sister who is also a member of NSBC. With these friends I have started to play in tournaments/events/congresses at other places in the state, making these outings, with a Bridge focus, a fun and enjoyable getaway.

I prefer playing Face to Face because of the direct interaction you have with people.

Whilst I think I have a good card sense. I am at the beginning of my Bridge journey and still need to learn some of the conventions of Bridge and generally continue to improve.

I play three times a week but am looking to build that to 4 times a week this year. I still attend the Rookie sessions run on an evening on Monday nights, by Jenny Barnes. She is a great teacher who gives a lesson prior to our playing, constantly expanding and growing my knowledge of the game.

Jenny, Patrick, Meera, Craig and all the other NSBC players on the list are to be congratulated on their achievements over the last 12 months – well done all

## DEAR DIRECTOR

My tip for this month. When you sit down at the bridge table or virtual table and you are playing against someone who you deem better than you. Try not to be nervous, or say “oh no we're playing against you!” Often players will get intimidated and not play their normal game. So just try to relax and have fun.

Board 12 Thursday East Lindfield Open F2F. There were lots of weird and wonderful scores around the room. I was asked about this hand quite a few times too. This is not a game force hand so don't open 2 Clubs. As South just open 1 Club. If you are lucky opps may come in with an unusual 2NT bid, showing 5 diamonds and 5 hearts. On this hand that is how I would have liked the bidding to go but it didn't turn out that way at my table! I opened 1 Club and E/W were silent.

My partner (I had not played with before) called 1 Spade. I got excited and we ended up in 3NT for not a bottom but a bad score. What I prefer is for my partner to call 2 Spades

which says I have 6 Spades but less than 5 HCP. I would then pass for a very good score. It doesn't make but it doesn't go off nearly as much as 3NT or 5 Clubs X Of course this is by partnership agreement

Board 3 Real Bridge (Open)

On this hand, South opens the bidding 1D, North responds 1 Heart and South calls 2 Diamonds, Pass, Pass - and now East comes in with a Takeout Double. West calls 2 Spades, North is happy to compete to 3 Diamonds with a nine card fit. East with a great hand calls 3 Spades. Now South called 4 Diamonds (I don't like this bid at all). You have pushed them to the 3 level don't bid your hand again you have a minimum hand. Yes 4 Spades does make but it is unlikely the opps are going to get to game only 1 pair did. 4 Diamonds X is a great score for East West.

## ASK GARY

### Pre-Alerting!

Pre-Alerts are distinct from standard Alerts. When playing a system or convention that may be unexpected for opponents during either the auction or play, it is necessary to pre-alert them at the beginning of each round.

In Australia, Standard (including its extension, 2/1) is the predominant system taught and played. If you employ an

alternative system—such as Precision, ACOL, Big Club, Polish Club, or similar—you must inform your opponents at the start of every round. This allows opponents to agree on their preferred defensive style prior to the auction.

Moreover, playing a convention that could surprise your opponents during bidding without offering a pre-alert at the start of each round is considered unethical. Within the Standard system, a 2C opening is regarded as strong and typically requires an Alert. If opponents later discover that your 2C opening was weak for both majors and were not given adequate time to discuss their defense, the director may assign an adjusted score. While playing 2C as weak in both majors is permissible, opponents must receive a pre-alert to appropriately prepare their response.
